## **Call to Order**

## **Adoption of Commission Rules**

Sen. Prettner Solon moved to adopt JCF0032, the proposed rules of the Legislative Energy Commission.

Rep. Hilty moved the following oral amendment:

Line 1.12, after "commission" insert "or if the commission has not held a meeting for 60 days". The Chair being in doubt of the result of the voice vote, asked for a division. There being 7 hands in favor and 8 hands against, the motion did not prevail. The amendment was not adopted.

Sen. Prettner Solon renewed her motion to adopt JCF0032, the proposed rules of the Legislative Energy Commission. **The Motion Prevailed.** 

# **Adoption of Commission Work Plan**

Rep. Hilty moved the LEC shall, in addition to other activities, undertake the tasks listed in the proposed work plan.

Rep. Knuth suggested including the impact of potential short and long term cost drivers including externalities in the framework for an integrated energy policy report. Sen. Anderson suggested adding the review of relevant federal legislation and regulation to item number two of the proposed work plan. Rep. Beard suggested deleting language in item number four of the work plan that referred to the LEC Coordinator.

Rep. Hilty incorporated the suggestions of Rep. Knuth, Sen. Anderson and Rep. Beard in his motion to adopt the proposed work plan. **The Motion Prevailed.** 

# **Hiring Staff**

Sen. Doll moved that the LEC direct the Director of the Legislative Coordinating Commission to prepare a job description for a Coordinator for the LEC and complete both a part time and full time cost estimation for the position.

## Presentation of Destination 2025 from Bio Business Alliance of Minnesota

Dale Wahlstrom, CEO of the BioBusiness Alliance of Minnesota (BBAM), spoke to the background of BBAM highlighting the three phases of evolution: assessment, vision and roadmap, and implementation. Mr. Wahlstrom then reviewed the process and outcomes of Destination 2025 project pointing out that it is a 20 year roadmap for the life science industry in Minnesota. He then spoke to recommendations from Destination 2025 in the area of agricultural and biomass.

Gregg Mast, Senior Program Manager of BBAM, gave overview of the first recommendation from Destination 2025, sustainable biomass management. Ken Smith, SVP of Ever-Green Energy, spoke to combustible biomass and the development of the biomass industry, the second recommendation from Destination 2025. Brian Tockman, Business Development Manager at Segetis, addressed the third recommendation, engineering and end product production.
